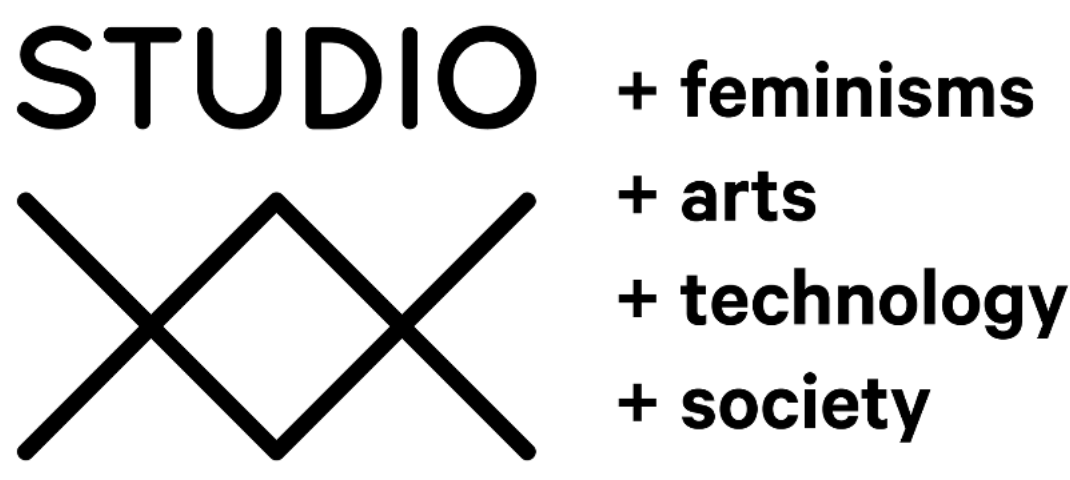

"Here, now, but also there, the artists propose turning the senses both inwards and outwards in an immersive experience of deprogramming expectations. In X-cosmos-X, screens and video overlap, multiplying textures and dimensions to inundate the senses. The underwater environments form a fluid topography, eminently immersive, conducive to contemplation; a wandering cosmos, a transitory state responsive to the flow of matter. In Black Womxn Temporal Portal, the virtual mingles with the IRL [1], forming an Afrofuturist sanctuary where black female, female and non-binary bodies can finally belong. Past, present and future dimensions are incorporated into a timeless vortex, forming a capsule where the mystical memory of a still speculative future can be forged." - Marilou Craft

Olivia McGilchrist is a Franco-Jamaican white multimedia artist and educator who addresses issues of identity and incarnation through virtual reality and video installation.

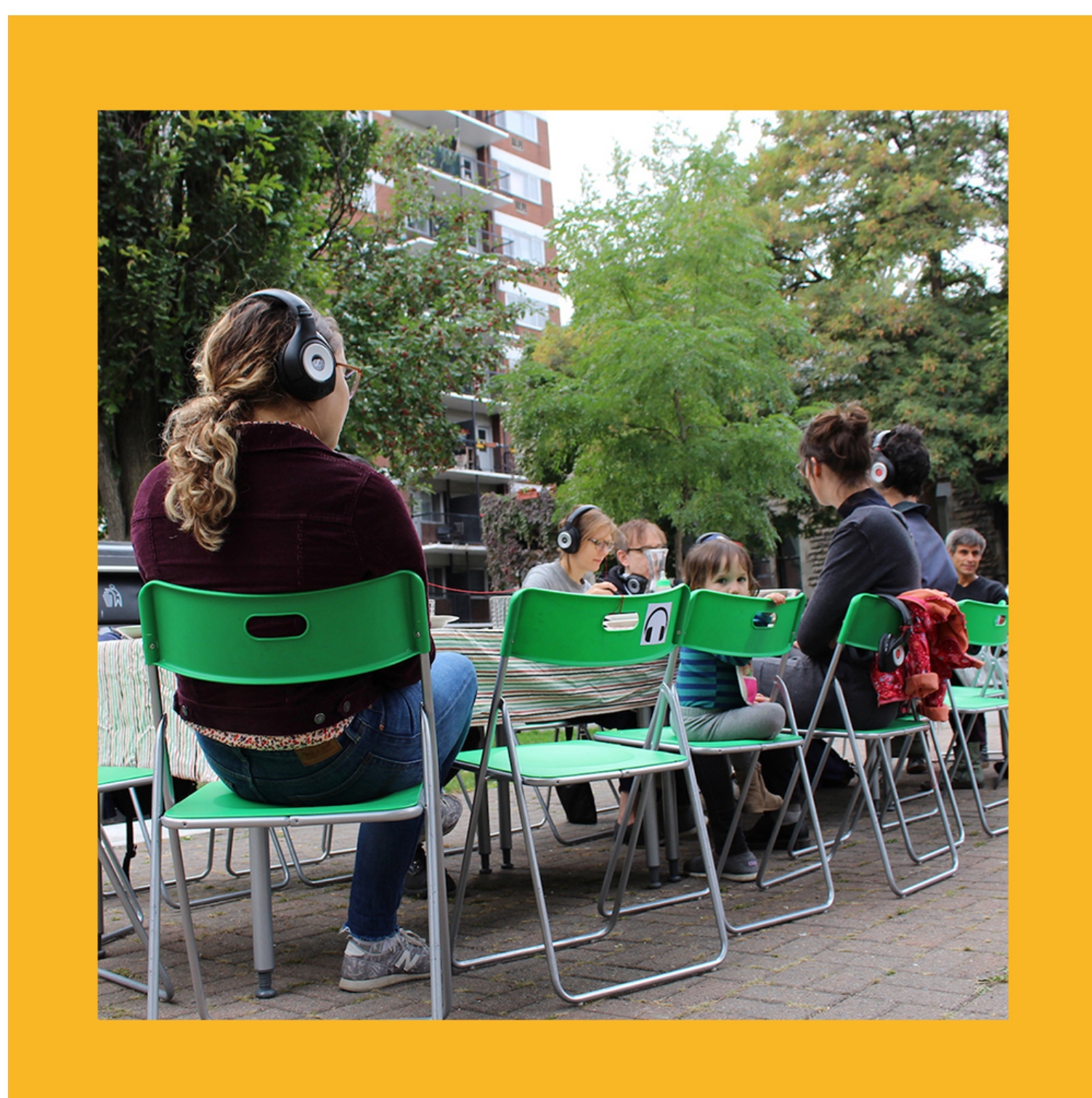
