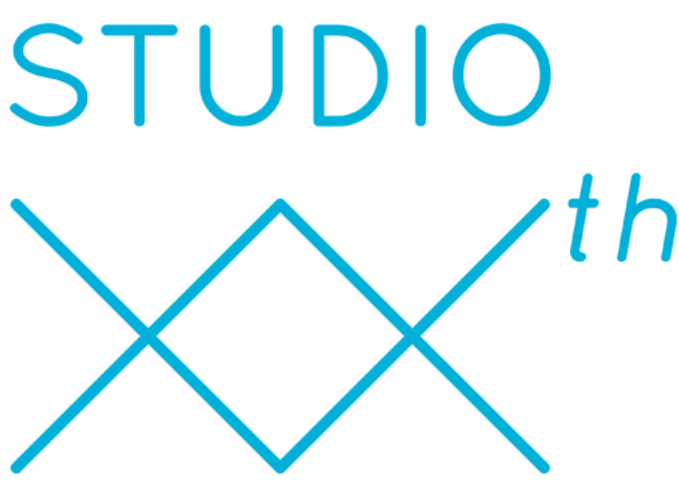

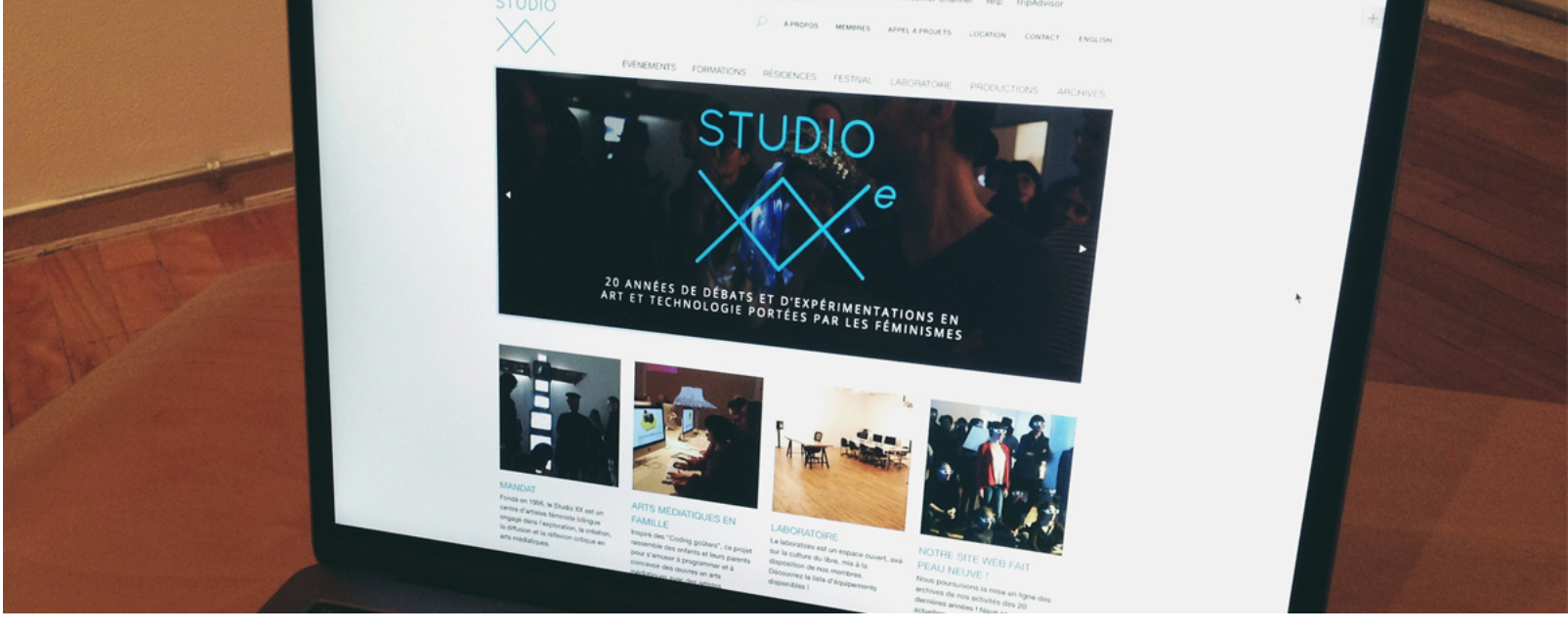

As the finale to Studio XX's 20th anniversary year, we are thrilled to present our new website.

The last time we redesigned our site was in 2008 when we launched the Matricules Archives.

To celebrate our 20th anniversary, we built a more accessible interface—one that highlights all the creators who have contributed to the Studio's story, as well as developing a dynamic way to browse 20 years of exhibitions, conferences, artist residencies and workshops.

ARTISTS IN RESIDENCY : JULIA DYCK, BELEN ARENAS, AMANDA HARVEY

Studio XX is pleased to host artists **Julia Dyck**, **Belen Arenas** and **Amanda Harvey** with their project "The XX-Files: exploring feminism & technology through sonic production", from May 3rd to June 14th, 2017, as part of our 2017-18 residency program.

The XX Files is a weekly radio show broadcast on CKUT 90.3FM. For the past 20 years, the rotating lineup of radio hosts have explored technology, art, and society from an intersectional feminist perspective.

The current hosts (Julia Dyck, Belen Arenas, Amanda Harvey) will use the residency at Studio XX to deepening the show's potential for experimentation and disembodied performance by dissecting the themes of identity production, memory creation, and sonic ownership and boundaries.

During this residency, the artists will produce three audio documentaries including journalism, drama, sound art, original music to be mixed and produced live as a audio visual performance. Focused mostly on sonic production, the audio will be enough to stand on its own in a radio broadcast, but will be accompanied by an experimental video. The audio visual experience will act as a live radio broadcast and performance. This ephemeral performance of live mixing and collaging of interviews, original music, media samples, and spoken word will be recorded and broadcast on the XX Files radio show afterwards.

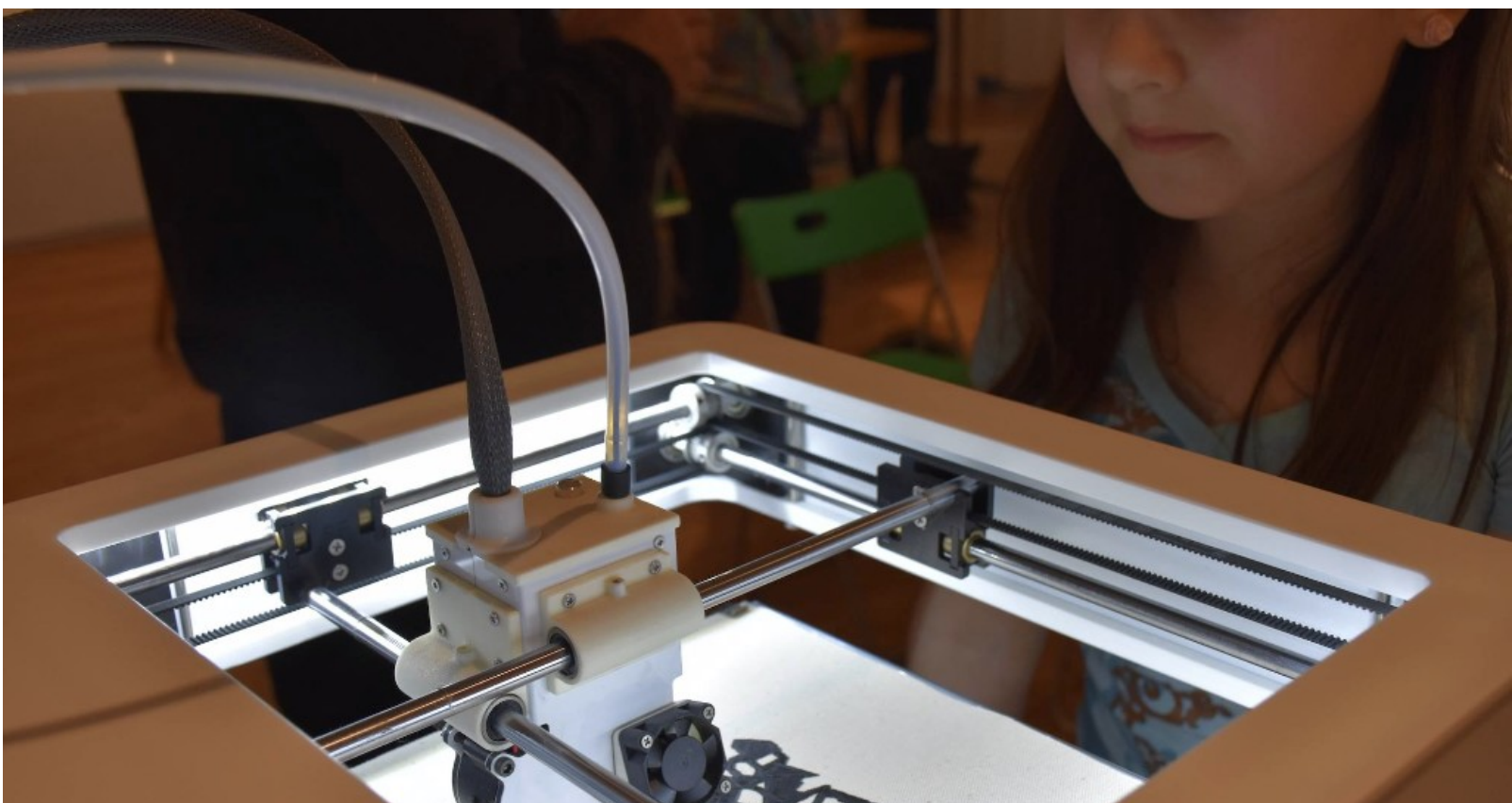

Capturing the medicinal regimens of 100 young women living in urban capitals, *Regimen* (2015–2017) reflects on a general pressure in Western society for people, notably women, to outperform their natural dispositions. The project reflects on processes and outcomes of diagnosis and normalizing perceptions of health. It asks: what is natural? Who and what can we trust with our health? These questions are explored through the medicinal regimens of these women— specifically, the motivations behind their often-changing consumption of or abstention from pharmaceuticals, supplements, vitamins, and recreational drugs. In this workshop, we will experiment with video mapping on 3D shapes and multi-screen video installations with poetry evocative of the theme of water.

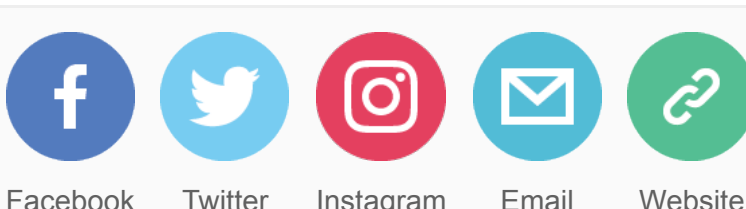
