





Annie Goh is an artist and researcher working primarily with sound, space, electronic media and generative processes within their social and cultural contexts. Currently based in London, she is undertaking a PhD on "Sonic Knowledge & Archaeoacoustics: A Geneaology of Echo" at Goldsmiths, University of London.

During her residency at Studio XX, she will develop her project *GenDyTrouble: Cyber*Feminist Computer Music.* This project draws on the common etymological ground between generative art/music and gender (lat. *genus*) in order to explore generative processes in electronic music.


CALL FOR PROPOSALS | Labsessions #14 Digital emerging artists' project presentations
